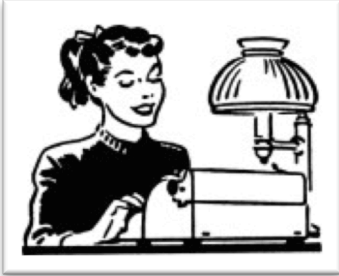


## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

What project are you working on today? I'm working on my "mini mosaic" quilt, from our recent workshop with Cheryl Lynch. These fabric mosaic quilts can become addictive—a good thing, since I now have at least a billion 3/8" squares of fabric!

We had a great workshop with Cheryl. Not only were guild members enjoying this new technique, but several guests, from other quilters' guilds, joined in the fun. It was my pleasure to meet those ladies, and I hope that they enjoyed spending time with us.

If you plan to take classes, or if you plan a day-trip to see the show, would you please consider volunteering some of your time to sell raffle tickets. I will be putting together a schedule, as time draws near, so mark your calendar. Volunteers will also be needed to sell tickets at other venues this year. Our raffle quilt is an important fundraiser for our guild, and I'm counting on all of you for your support.

Please be sure to pick up instructions for making blocks for the 2018 Raffle Quilt. Donna Martinez will have them available at the April meeting. We are hoping that there will be enough member participation, so a "workers' quilt" can be made, as well. For our newer members, the "workers' quilt" is made from leftover raffle quilt blocks, so it is not a large quilt, but it is a nice memento of that year's quilt. Those who participate in making the raffle quilt have an opportunity to win the workers' quilt. I remember those quilts when I joined the guild and am happy to bring back that tradition.

Well, that's a wrap! I'm going back to working on my mini mosaic quilt. I look forward to seeing you at our April meeting. In the meantime, sew like no one is watching!

For our newer members, just a little info about this part of the show: members donate these items, tickets are sold, and lucky winners take home great stuff. Member participation has always been very good, and we are optimistic that will continue for our 2017 show.

While October may not be right around the corner, you can get started now on your small quilt. Here's how you can participate.

Small quilts, table runners, placemats and napkins (for at least a service for four), pillows, tote bags, and wool work (such as candle mats and penny rugs) are accepted. Your small quilt cannot be larger than 30" x 30". We will have limited space in which to display these items, so smaller is better. We will not be able to accept quilts larger than the max size noted. Mug rugs will not be placed with the small quilts. They can be included in a basket, along with other items, or they can be donated to Aunt Sukey. To give you inspiration, here are some ideas for your small quilt. You can choose to make something celebrating a season or holiday; we have had beautiful red work and blue work quilts; appliqué quilts, either by hand or machine; a quilt featuring machine embroidery; and paper-pieced quilts—just to name a few. Be sure to check out the many books in our guild library for more inspiration. As soon as you have finished your project, please give it to either of us. Please don't wait until set-up night, as each item needs to be photographed.

Stay tuned for information about the gift baskets. We'll talk about them as we get a little closer to the show. We're hoping to have another great turnout for Small Quilts and Gift Baskets. So, get started on your projects. If you have any questions, please let us know.

The meeting was called to order by President Regina Apuzzo at 7:30 p.m.  
We had 43 members and 8 guests present.

Vice-President Linda Martin-Mills introduced our speaker, Cheryl Lynch, who spoke about her journey in quilting and writing, and where to get inspiration in everyday designs around us for designing our quilts. She led a workshop in mini-mosaic quilt

designing earlier in the day, and some of the results were displayed by the participants. Cheryl also announced that she would be teaching the mosaic quilt workshop again at Byrne's Sewing Connection on Tuesday, May 2, if anyone was interested in taking the workshop. Regina announced that membership cards were available to members at the membership sign-in table.

Regina also announced that since Christa Froehlich was the current newsletter editor, she was relinquishing the office of Recording Secretary due to time constraints. Regina then announced that Diana Leslie had volunteered to take the office, and asked for a motion to accept Diana as the secretary. The motion was made by Betsy Smyth, seconded by Barbara Wyatt, and the motion was approved by the membership.

It was announced that one of our members, Camille Amadio, has had a quilt accepted into the AQS show in Paducah.

A mystery quilt workshop is planned for Saturday, May 20, from 10 till 4. Place of workshop to be announced. Sign-ups are being taken now. This is especially offered for those who may not be able to attend on weekdays.

A workshop with Lisa Calle, longarm quilter and quilt author, is planned for Tuesday, June 20, which will focus on drawing your own quilting designs.
