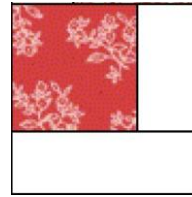

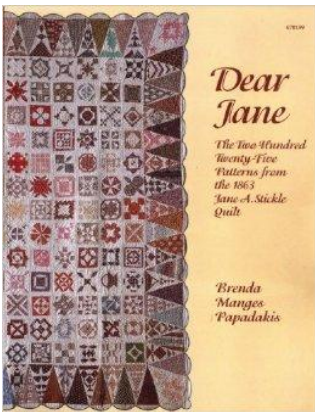

Calling All Dear Janes!



During the "Show and Tell" at the January meeting, I spoke about the possibility of starting a "Dear Jane" group. For those of you not familiar with the Dear Jane Quilt, here is a bit of information.

Jane A. Stickle, born on April 8, 1817 in Vermont is the creator of the legendary Dear Jane Quilt. She made the quilt during the Civil War and completed it in 1863. The quilt is a sampler made of 169 square 5" blocks with each block a different pattern. The quilt also has border triangles and a scalloped border. The original quilt can be found at the Bennington Museum in Vermont.

For years, there has been interest around the world related to the Dear Jane Quilt. There are many blogs on the web that give lots of interesting information, and pictures of hundreds of Dear Jane quilts made by quilters. Some quilts use repro fabrics, others don't.

In 1996, Brenda Papadakis published a book called, "Dear Jane: The Two Hundred Twenty Five Patterns from the 1863 Jane A. Stickle Quilt." The book is available on Amazon.

Some quilters purchase pre-cut fabric kits with directions as a Dear Jane Block of the month while others may choose to use the book as a guide or purchase the CD of patterns and instructions.

The "Dear Jane" group being proposed will not be a workshop group but more of a group that will get together to discuss their Dear Jane quilt no matter what stage- from very beginning to well on the road to completion, fabric selection, perhaps sew a block or two and help each other to make our own Dear Jane masterpiece.

Another member, Leanne Gillen is a Dear Jane fan and may also be reaching out to interested members. While the details are not finalized, we're at the stage of generating interest among members and working on the details. We're planning to meet at a member's home in Yardley.
