




PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

At the June meeting, I reported that we had received notice from Public Storage that our rental fee for our storage unit will be increasing to \$127.20 per month which will make the annual cost of the storage unit \$1,526.40. And Diana Leslie very nicely reported that it contains: the wooden quilt show frames, signs for the quilt show, drapes for the quilt show pole and drape, misc. workshop tools, the wooden quilt display hanger, and some old guild records and picture albums. A majority of the space is used by the old Quilt Show wooden frames, we did not use them in the last two shows and will not be using them in our upcoming show. Quilt Show - A Stitch in Time

All of the chair people will be reaching out to members to ask for assistance and contributions for items. Please consider how important this show is to the well being and financial health of this guild. We want to provide great programs and can do so with the funds from a successful show. Remember that the show is everyone's responsibility. And thanks for always contributing! For those new members we want to explain that everyone who is a member of the guild is entitled to hang quilts in the show. Dependent upon space, everyone gets their first choice hung. You may request to hang others as well. If you participated in workshops or challenges those will get displayed.

The quilt show is titled "A Stitch in Time" and will be held on October 14 and 15th 9-5 each day. Set up is on Friday evening and we have such fun making our show so special. We will meet at the Masonic Hall of Yardley after 5pm on Friday (eat dinner at home or bring a brown bag dinner) and we will work until we are done. We need many hands to make the work go fast. This is a great place for new members to come and get "dirty" and really learn the inner workings of hanging the show.

Saturday, the doors will open at 9. Café will serve breakfast goodies and coffee and tea. Throughout the day we will have nibbles, hors d'oeuvre type snacks and beverages. The café folks would like us to contribute grocery cards to offset the costs of the goodies and we will be asking you all to bake as well.

At the show we will have small quilts and basket raffles – we ask you to donate a basket or small quilt (or both) and we will raffle them off.

Aunt Sukie's Attic sale is where we take all the things that the members have donated from their studios and stashes and mark them very reasonably. This is pure profit for the guild – so please look over your sewing room and clean out that fabric that has been laying around and you really don't want anymore. One woman's trash is another's treasure!

Tickets to the show are \$8 and there is a \$1 discount on the postcards and flyers that we will be handing out. This year we need to have every member bring out their friends and family and make this show a real success. Foot traffic is the key to us being successful.

On Sunday we gather again to break down the show which takes hours to put up and about an hour to take down!

We really need every member, new or old to help this year in contributing where they can and make this show a success. Thanks.

Small Quilts & Gift Baskets Committee (Rosemary Dwyer and Regina Apuzzo)

Hi Everyone!

Now is the time for you to be making your Small Quilt for our Raffle. As soon as you have finished, please bring it to our guild meeting. Here's how you can participate.

Small quilts, table runners, placemats and napkins (for at least a service for four), pillows, tote bags, and wool work (such as candle mats and penny rugs) are accepted. Your small quilt cannot be larger than 30" x 30". We will have limited space in which to display these items, so smaller is better. We will not be able to accept quilts larger than the max size noted. Mug rugs will not be placed with the small quilts. They can be included in a basket, along with other items, or they can be donated to Aunt Sukie. To give you inspiration, here are some ideas for your small quilt. You can choose to make something celebrating a season or holiday; we have had beautiful red work and blue work quilts; appliqué quilts, either by hand or machine; a quilt featuring machine embroidery; and paper-pieced quilts—just to name a few. Be sure to check out the many books in our guild library for more inspiration.

For the gift baskets: Grab a few quilting buddies and put together a basket, or you, alone, can fill one. Any food included in your basket must be shelf stable/nonperishable. Your basket can have a theme; such as, sewing notions, fabrics, gift cards to restaurants, tea, coffee, chocolate, etc. Use your imagination and creativity! Be sure to give your basket a name. We ask that its value be at least \$25.00. Please wrap your basket in **clear** cello wrap, only. Baskets are due either at the September guild meeting, or they can be brought to the show venue on set-up night (preferable). Please don't bring them in sooner than September. Since we have a new venue for our 2017 show, it is quite possible that we will have more visitors from the general public. So, it would be great to have baskets that would interest non-quilters. Now is the time to start planning your basket. Beginning in July, we will have a sign-up sheet, as we need to know ahead of time, the donor(s), basket name, and basket contents, so tags can be made.

Small Quilts and Gift Baskets are very popular with our quilt show visitors. For our newer members, just a little info about this part of the show: members donate these items, tickets are sold, and lucky winners take home great stuff. Member participation has always been very good, and we are optimistic that will continue for our 2017 show. This is a very important fundraising activity for our show, with 100% of the proceeds going to the guild. We need everyone to participate to make this a success. What is your favorite quilt batting and why?

Results as follows:

Hobbs Heirloom 100% wool-1

Hobbs wool batting-11 (lovely loft, shows of quilting designs, doesn't shrink when washed, light and fluffy but warm, I use this for show quilts)

Hobbs 80/20-1 (soft & puffy, light weight but warm)

Hobbs-11

Hobbs Tuscany wool(hand quilting)

Hobbs 20%wool/80%cotton-11

Hobbs Tuscany silk -1

Quilter's dream-12 (like for twins & larger/ is a little stretchy/ is nice for larger quilts-so soft & drapes nicely/ 2 people said I like it for hand quilting/

Quilter's dream 70/30-3 (quilts up a little fuller to showcase the quilting)

Quilter's dream cotton select-7 (2 people said they preferred this for hand quilting/nice & soft, quilts easily, gives a nice amount of "pouf"/ I use this for philanthropy quilts and customer quilts)

Quilter's dream cotton request-2 (hand quilting)

Quilter's dream wool-1 (for long arm/ prefer for long arm machine quilting)

Warm & Natural- 17 (not too bulky for machine quilting, would not use for hand quilting/ like for crib or throw size quilts/ find it easier to pin quilts together/ can quilt up to 10 inches apart, nice weight/ 2 people said I like it for machine quilting/ like for thickness and 10" apart)

Warm & White- 3 (can quilt up to 10 inches apart, nice weight/

Mountain mist-1

Whatever is on sale-1

MINUTES OF THE NEWTOWN QUILTERS GUILD MEETING ON JUNE 20, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m.

Our speaker for the evening was Lisa Calle, who led an afternoon workshop for guild members earlier in the day. Lisa spoke about her journey as a quilter, from a beginning quilter to a longarm quilter and finally to a quilter who quilts primarily show quilts and teaches her techniques for quilting and planning quilting designs.

The guild then enjoyed strawberry shortcake as for our traditional birthday meeting dessert.

It was announced that we will be able to sell tickets for our raffle quilt at the Round Bobbin Quilt Shop in Hatboro on Saturday, September 23. We will also be selling tickets at Quilt Odyssey in Hershey on Friday, July 21, and Saturday, July 22. Volunteers are needed to sit at the table and sell tickets for both of these venues. If you will be going to the Hershey show on either Friday or Saturday, please consider volunteering some time while you are there.

If you haven't picked up your raffle tickets, please see Marion Baranosky at the meeting.

Donna Laing reported that the Camp Erin gathering was held on the weekend of June 9, and the camp was outfitted with 106 quilts, many of them from the guild.

Joan Shipp, corresponding secretary, sent get-well cards to Barbara McClintock, and Rosemary Torelli.

Present this evening were 45 members and 6 guests.

Name tag prize was won by Kim Moll, Treasurer trivia prize went to Pat Morrison, and quilty prize was won by Joan Shipp.

Treasurer Donna Martinez reported that our storage unit price has increased, and that the guild should consider whether to keep the quilt frames that are stored there or find a cheaper alternative for storing them.

Donna is also asking for return of blocks for the 2018 raffle quilt if you have your blocks finished, as she would like to assemble the quilt over the summer.

Linda Martin-Mills announced that there is still room for anyone wanting to join in the mystery quilt workshop, to be held at Addisville church on our meeting date, Tuesday, July 18, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Cost is \$25. There is some preliminary cutting/sewing to be done prior to the workshop, but we welcome anyone wishing to join us for a day of fun and sewing with friends. Call Diana Leslie or Linda Martin-Mills if you want to join in.

Diana Leslie noted that soon you will hear about preregistration of quilts for the quilt show in October. Plan ahead and choose which of your quilts you would like to see hanging in our show. This is not a "jurying" process, but we ask you to prioritize your quilts as we will have limited space for hanging quilts.

Regina reminded us to work on small quilts and baskets for the auction of these items. If you have finished quilts ready to turn in, bring them to the guild meetings to give to Regina or Rosemary Dwyer.

Marsha Watro will soon have a sign-up sheet for volunteers to work at the show.
