

## **Medallion BOM- Month 2 using the color wheel**

This month (February) we will be making flying geese using the four-at-a-time method. There are a lot of YouTube videos displaying this method. You will be making 13 sets of four for a total of 52.

### **Color wheel:**

Split complementary color scheme uses a main color and two colors next to its complement on the color wheel. For example, the split complementary color for pink is generally teal and emerald or yellow,-green and blue-green.

(You can search on the computer for what a **split complementary** color is for the color you're working with)

Cutting: slightly different measurements than the pattern suggests so that you can trim down your blocks.

\*Background fabric: (52) 3"squares

\*Assortment of split complementary colors that you're working with this month (some of them can be duplicates, I also mixed in some of my main color).

(13) 5-1/2" squares

After completing your four-at-a-time flying geese, trim them down to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" (2" x4" finished). Join them like the picture shows.

I used Quilt Maven Dave's method of not losing my points by using dental floss. You can look this up on YouTube or see the post on our private Facebook page.

Assembling the Center medallion comes next month. I feel like this gives time for people to catch up if needed.
